Course Description

This course is designed for students who have limited English language proficiency and/or have completed ELL 1. In this course students will be exposed to more World literature selections based on their grade level and individual instructional needs. By using a variety of works, the students will develop critical and divergent thinking skills.

Objectives:

The students will:

- Increase their English vocabulary
- Read selections in English
- Strengthen summarizing and sequencing skills
- Improve comprehension skills
- Identify and interpret different types of text
- Identify story elements and literary devices
- Develop critical and divergent thinking skills

Novel selections based on grade level and individual needs

Various other supplementary materials will also be used

Required Materials:

All students must bring the following items to class **every day**:

- Binder with section for ELL A
- Pens, pencils, and erasers
- **Completed homework assignments**

Class Expectations and Requirements:

Attendance:

Daily attendance is extremely important for your success in this class. When a student is absent from school, he/she is responsible for obtaining and turning in any work missed. If the student misses a test, or a quiz, he/she need to make arrangements for a time to make up the quiz/test. If a student needs extra help with a lesson or concept and would like to re-take a test, he/she must make arrangements with the teacher.

The student will receive a zero (0) for any work missed due to an unexcused absence.

Homework:

The student is expected to review the class notes on a nightly basis, even if there is no written homework for the night. No homework will be accepted after the due date, unless the student was absent from class.

Grading Policy:

Student's grade will be based on the total number of points accumulated on class participation, class work, homework, quizzes, tests, and projects divided by the total possible. The number of points assigned to each item will be determined by its length and complexity.
