**Course Description**

This course is designed for students who have limited English language proficiency and/or have completed ELL 1. In this course students will continue to build their cognitive academic language with emphasis on correct conventions (vocabulary development, sentence formation, grammar, and effective word choice).

**Objectives:**

The students will:

- Increase their English vocabulary
- Write with correct sentence structure
- Develop spelling skills
- Practice listening, speaking, reading, and writing in English
- Improve pronunciation skills
- Make effective word choices

**Texts**

*Focus on Grammar Basic Level*

*Grammar in Context 1 and 2*

Various other supplementary materials will also be used

**Class Expectations and Requirements**

Students are expected to follow all school rules and regulations as well as the following classroom rules:

- Use appropriate language and dress appropriately.
- Raise your hand and wait for the teacher's permission to talk.
- Ask for permission before getting out of your seat.
- Students have 3 bathroom passes for each marking period.
